MAJORITY OWNER

William "Bill" Cameron is President and Chief Executive Officer of Cameron Enterprises, the holding company for the Cameron family's business holdings and is Chairman and CEO of American Fidelity Group. American Fidelity Assurance Company is the largest of the member business group that also includes First Fidelity Bank; INSURICA, the 23rd largest private insurance agency operation in the United States; InvesTrust, a trust and investment management group; Alcott, a Professional Employer Organization based in Long Island, New York; and First Financial Group based in Houston.

Bill is a partial owner and serves on the boards for the NBA's Oklahoma City Thunder, as well as the lead owner and chairman of the WNBA franchise, Dallas Wings. He is a partner in BCellars winery in Oakville, California. A former Chairman for the Amazon Conservation Team, headquartered in Arlington, Virginia.

Bill Cameron is active in organizations such as the U.S. life and health insurance industry's trade associations, served as Chairman for the Association of California Life and Health Insurance, board member for America's Health Insurance Plans, and a former director with American Council of Life Insurers. He is a member of the Brookings Council, and Center for Strategic and International Studies advisory council for Global Strategy Institute. Cameron serves on several Oklahoma based community boards, including Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation and Oklahoma City's Metropolitan Area Projects (MAPS-3) Downtown Public Park initiative.

Bill is a member of Young Presidents' Organization and former international board member. He is also a member of the Chief Executive Organization.

Bill is a graduate from Dartmouth College in Hanover, New Hampshire. He resides in Oklahoma.



GREG BIBB

PRESIDENT, CEO & MANAGING PARTNER

Greg Bibb, a 20-plus-year sports industry veteran, leads the Panther City Lacrosse Club in his role as President, CEO and Managing Partner. Bibb also serves as the President and CEO for the Dallas Wings of the WNBA.

Bibb was essential in securing the rights to the 14th member club of the National Lacrosse League in July of 2020, as well as the development and launch of the team's name and brand. He also oversaw the hiring of the team's General Manager and Vice President of Lacrosse Operations, Bob Hamley, while securing Dickies Arena, Fort Worth's world-class venue, to serve as the home field for the club.

In his role, Bibb plays an active part in overall league leadership, as

a member of the National Lacrosse League Board of Governors and holds a seat on the NLL Finance & Audit Committee, as well as the NLL Marketing, Commercial Properties and Broadcasting Committee. In his first year involved with the NLL in 2021-22, Bibb was named a finalist for the NLL Executive of the Year, after securing the largest partnership deal in the history of the NLL..

With the WNBA's Dallas Wings, Bibb has been the guiding force for the team on and off the court, as he helped reshape the coaching staff, roster and front office staff. Bibb was named the General Manager in November of 2015 and was appointed President, CEO and Partner in April of 2017.

Under his guidance, the Wings have drafted and developed a bevy of talent on the court. The Wings have selected eight WNBA All-Rookie Team selections since 2016, including 2017 WNBA Rookie of the Year, Allisha Gray. Also included in this group is Arike Ogunbowale (5th overall selection in 2019), who was the 2020 WNBA Scoring Champion, a 2020 All WNBA First-Team honoree, and the 2021 WNBA All-Star Game MVP. Satou Sabally (2nd overall selection in 2020) was named to the 2020 WNBA All-Rookie Team and is a two-time All-Star.

On the business side, Bibb directed the team's turnaround that has transformed the Wings into one of the highest revenue producing teams in the WNBA, while also guiding the Wings to significant gains in attendance, corporate partnerships, media reach and brand awareness.

Prior to joining the Wings, Bibb served three years as the Executive Vice President of Business Operations for the Washington Wizards and five seasons as the Washington Mystics Chief Operating Officer. His responsibilities with both teams included overseeing numerous business functions including marketing, communications, community relations, game operations, digital media, video production, analytics, and the camps and clinics program.


Bibb spent two years as the President of Hantz Group Sports & Entertainment where he was instrumental in the launch of the Detroit Ignition of the Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL). HAMLEY BOB

GENERAL MANAGER & VICE PRESIDENT OF LACROSSSE OPERATIONS

Bob Hamley, a 20-year plus veteran of the National Lacrosse League, serves as the Vice President of Lacrosse Operations and General Manager for the Panther City Lacrosse Club. He joined the club in September of 2020.

Hamley is responsible for the hiring of Head Coach Tracey Kelusky, the 2022 Les Bartley NLL Coach of the Year winner and through his roster construction helped Panther City qualify to their first double-digit win campaign, tallying a 10-8 record and qualifying for the playoffs for the first time in franchise history by finishing as the third seed in the Western Conference in 2022-23. In their inaugural season, Panther City recorded more wins than the previous two NLL expansion clubs' first seasons combined, as

Panther City won seven games, including a five-game winning streak. For his efforts in 2021-22, Hamley was named a finalist for the 2022 NLL General Manger of the Year Award.

Hamley's ability to scout and develop talent, while also acquiring and signing impact players has been at the forefront of Panther City's success and allowed the team to be competitive from their very first day. He drafted Jonathan Donville first overall with the team's first ever NLL Entry Draft selection in 2021. Donville took home the NLL Rookie of the Year award in 2022-23 after leading all rookies in points (90), which were the fourth-most ever by a rookie in NLL history, and assists (67), which were the second-most ever by a rookie in NLL history. He finished second amongst rookies with 23 goals. For his efforts, Donville was named NLL Rookie of the Week five times this past season, more than any other rookie in the league. Donville finished 9th in the NLL with 67 assists and his 29 power play assists were the most in the league and he finished tied for second in the NLL with 31 power play points. Under the direction of Hamley, Panther City, in its short history has had four different players win the NLL Rookie of the Week honors for a total of 10 times (Donville 5x, Patrick Dodds: 3x, Dean Fairall & Mathieu Gautiuer). In 2021-22, Hamley acquired four rookies who finished in the top-20 in rookie points, including All-Rookie Team member, Patrick Dodds, who finished second amongst rookies in scoring in 2021-22.

Hamley has also had success outside of the draft, acquiring or signing players that have had made an instant impact on the team and asserted themselves as some of the best at their position in the NLL. Will Malcom was acquired prior to the 2021-22 season and in 2022-23, Malcom led the team with 96 points (35G/61A), which was the first 90+ point season in franchise history and his goals and assists totals were both top 15 in the league. Goalie Nick Damude was also a key acquisition for Hamley as the goalie has improved each year since arriving in Panther City. Last season, Damude finished third in the NLL in Goals Against Average (GAA) with a GAA of 10.31. Damude allowed the fewest goals in a single game in the '22-23 season when he only allowed three goals against Las Vegas on 12/16, which made him only the fifth goalie in NLL history to allow three or fewer goals in a full regular-season game. Also defensively, Hamley acquired defenseman Matt Hossack in the 2021 NLL Expansion Draft. Hossack finished seventh in the NLL in caused turnovers (28) in 2022-23, while also recording 111 loose balls. Transition Player Josh Medeiros was signed as a free agent prior to the start of Panther City's inaugural season and in 2022-23 led all transition players with 21 goals, nearly tripling his rookie season goal output (8 goals in '21-22), en route to numerous career highs such as goals, loose balls (91) and caused turnovers (12).



GENERAL MANAGER & VICE PRESIDENT OF LACROSSSE OPERATIONS

Hamley played in the NLL for four years and won back-to-back championships with the Buffalo Bandits in 1992-1993. Following his playing career, Hamley has enjoyed a successful run as Head Coach and or General Manager for 16 years throughout the league.

Prior to joining Panther City, Hamley served as the National Director of 3D Lacrosse in Georgia where he was responsible for the company's day-to-day operations. Here he helped develop the game of lacrosse, young players and coaches in market and assisted high school lacrosse players pursue scholarships at the collegiate level. Through Hamley's extensive nation-wide lacrosse network he was able to help place players at Michigan, John's Hopkins, Albany and Air Force.

From 2010-2014, Hamley was the Head Coach and Director of Player Personnel for the Colorado Mammoth. The team made the playoffs every year of Hamley's tenure and he was a part of the personnel department that drafted 2011 NLL Rookie of the Year Adam Jones. From 2008-2009, Hamley served as the Head Coach and General Manager for the Edmonton Rush.

Hamley was named the Head Coach and General Manager of the Columbus Landsharks in 2002 and remained with the team as they relocated to Arizona as the Arizona Sting. He remained with the team until 2008. During his tenure with the Sting, Hamley was named the Head Coach and General Manager of the Year in 2005, the first time the award was given to the one person in the same year. The team made the NLL Western Finals three straight years from 2005-07 and reached the championship game in 2005 and 2007.

In 2001, Hamley received his first shot on the bench as he was named an assistant coach with the Albany Attack. The team reached the NLL Championship game in his first season.

The Owen Sound, Ontario native currently resides in Fort Worth with his wife, Lisa and the couple have two children, Brock and Kelsea.



TRACEY KELUSKY

HEAD COACH

Tracey Kelusky (17-18) enters his third season as the Head Coach of the Panther City Lacrosse Club.

In 2022-23 in his second season at the helm of Panther City, Kelusky led the team to 10 wins, the first double-digit wins campaign in franchise history and also secured a playoff spot in just the team's second season, by finishing in third place in the Western Conference. As a team, Kelusky oversaw a power-play unit that finished fourth in the NLL and recorded the second-most power play goals (44). Kelusky also oversaw the development of 2023 NLL Rookie of the Year Jonathan Donville who led all rookies in points (90) and assists (67), while leading the NLL with 29 power play assists. Kelusky was also instrumental in the growth

of third-year forward Will Malcom who finished the season with 96 points (35G/61A) and became the first player in Panther City Lacrosse Club history to record a 90+ point season. Defensively, goalie Nick Damude took a massive step forward this season and helped lead the team to 10 wins, while having the third-best GAA amongst starting goalies (10.31).

Under the direction of Kelusky, Panther City, in its short history has had four different players win the NLL Rookie of the Week honors for a total of 10 times (Donville 5x, Patrick Dodds: 3x, Dean Fairall & Mathieu Gautiuer).

Panther City Lacrosse Club had one of the most successful seasons ever for an expansion club in NLL history in their inaugural campaign in 2021-22. Panther City won seven games, which was more wins than the previous two expansion teams combined and also oversaw a five-game winning streak and had the team in the playoff hunt up until the final weekend of the season.

For his work, Kelusky was awarded the 2021-22 Les Bartley NLL Head Coach of the Year Award. Kelusky is the first head coach of an expansion team to win Coach of the Year honors since Derek Keenan won the award for the Portland Lumberjax in 2006.

In 2021-22, Kelusky adjusted mid-season to make Panther City one of the NLL's most potent offenses, especially on the man advantage, as the team finished in the top half in the league on the power play and on the penalty kill. Kelusky's offense also recorded the highest scoring output in the NLL in 2021-22 as they team recorded 20 goals against the eventual 2021-22 NLL Champions, the Colorado Mammoth.

Kelusky is a long-standing NLL veteran from Peterborough, Ontario, compiling 383 goals, 440 assists and 823 points during his illustrious 14-year career. After announcing his retirement from the NLL, he joined the coaching ranks of the New England Blackwolves before moving on to the Philadelphia Wings to serve as their offensive coach.



HEAD COACH

In addition to his work with the NLL, Kelusky has served as an assistant coach with the Peterborough Lakers of Major Series Lacrosse, and he was also an assistant coach with Finland during the FIL World Indoor Lacrosse Championships in 2015.

The No. 1 overall pick in the 2000 NLL Entry Draft, Kelusky was the Rookie of the Year in 2001, and went on to become a five-time NLL All Star, the All-Star MVP in 2005 and a NLL Sportsmanship Award winner in 2007. Kelusky also has considerable postseason experience, netting 37 goals, 30 assists and 67 points over the course of 16 playoff games. His 37 playoff goals rank ninth all time in NLL history and helped lead Calgary to NLL Championships in 2004 and 2009. In September of 2016, Kelusky was inducted into the National Lacrosse League Hall of Fame during his second stint on the ballot for his extraordinary contributions. In November of 2023, Kelusky was inducted into the Ontario Lacrosse Hall of Fame.

In addition to NLL success, Kelusky also displayed dominance internationally and in other lacrosse organizations. He racked up 499 points in 159 regular season games with Major Series Lacrosse and Western Lacrosse Association teams from 1993-2013 and was a member of the Canadian team that won the 2003 FIL World Indoor Lacrosse Championship. He also captured gold indoors with Team Canada in 2007 and 2011 and Silver at the 2002 World Lacrosse Championships.

A former University of Hartford standout, Kelusky still holds the program record for goals in a season (59 in 2000, goals per game in a season (4.21 in 2000), the top mark for points per game in a season (5.93 in 2000) and stands second in all-time career goals (139), points (209) and single season point total (83 in 2000). He was inducted into the University of Hartford Alumni Hall of Fame in 2006.

Kelusky, who owns Evolve Elite Lacrosse, lives in Peterborough, Ontario with his wife Emily and son Kellar.



STEVE TOLL
DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Steve Toll enters his third season as the Defensive Coordinator for the Panther City Lacrosse Club.

In his second season overseeing the defensive unit, Panther City finished tied for fourth in the NLL in goals against average (10.72). Additionally, Goalie Nick Damude finished third in the NLL in goals against average with a GAA of 10.31. Damude allowed the fewest goals in a single game in the '22-23 season when he only allowed three goals against Las Vegas on 12/16, which made him only the fifth goalie in NLL history to allow three or fewer goals in a full regular-season game. Defenseman Matt Hossack also finished seventh in the NLL amongst defenders with 28 caused turnovers while also scooping 111 loose balls to lead the defense

In his first season overseeing the defense, Toll oversaw a unit that was led by Liam Byrnes who finished fifth amongst NLL defenders with 137 loose balls and tenth in the NLL with 26 caused turnovers.

Toll won the NLL Championship five times during his illustrious 14 year playing career, four times with the Toronto Rock and once with the Rochester Knighthawks. In addition to his time in Toronto and Rochester, Toll played for Edmonton, Colorado, San Jose, and Ontario. Toll was named the first-ever National Lacrosse League Transition Player of the Year in 2007. In 2023, he was inducted into the NLL Hall of Fame.

After retiring from the NLL in 2011, Toll served as the Director of Operations for teams in the Canadian Lacrosse League. In addition to his NLL success, Toll was inducted into the City of St. Catharine's Hall of Fame in 2018 and is a two-time member of the Team Canada World Indoor Lacrosse Gold Medal Team.



KYLE GOUNDREY

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Kyle Goundrey is entering his second season as the Offensive Coordinator for the Panther City Lacrosse Club.

In his first season as Offensive Coordinator, Goundrey oversaw the Panther City power-play unit that finished fourth in the NLL and recorded the second-most power play goals (44). He also oversaw the development of 2023 NLL Rookie of the Year Jonathan Donville who led all rookies in points (90) and assists (67), while leading the NLL with 29 power play assists. Will Malcom finished the season with 96 points (35G/61A) and became the first player in Panther City Lacrosse Club history to record a 90+ point season.

Goundrey served as the Western Scout for Panther City during the 2021-22 campaign after playing 11 years in the National Lacrosse League. He most recently served as the Head Coach for the Delta Islanders of the British Columbia Junior A Lacrosse League.

A left-handed forward from Richmond, British Columbia, Goundrey won two NLL Championships with the Calgary Roughnecks in 2004 and 2009 and for his career, totaled 312 points on 97 goals and 215 assists. Goundrey and Panther City Head Coach Tracey Kelusky were teammates on both championship runs with Calgary and the two have a long history of being teammates with one another, as they also both played Junior A lacrosse together in Peterborough, Ontario.



Power Play Prowl

As a team, Panther City is 44-86 (51%) on the power play this year, which is the fourth best mark in the NLL. Jonathan Donville leads the league with 29 power-play assists.

Malcom Making Moves

Since joining the Panther City Lacrosse Club, forward Will Malcom has been one of the club's most consistent offensive threats. Malcom has recorded a point in every game he has played in in a Panther City jersey (35 games) and has scored a goal in 32 of the 35 games he has played in.

For the season, Malcom has 96 points, which is a new franchise record for most points scored in a single-season. Patrick Dodds previously held the record after finishing the 2021-2 season with 84 points.

Rookie of the Year In Reach

Jonathan Donville became the 10th rookie in NLL history to record 50 assists in a player's first season against Las Vegas (3/18). The last rookie to accomplish this feat was Panther City's own Patrick Dodds last season when he recorded 58 assists.

Against Calgary (4/8), Donville recorded his 61st assist, which adds to the franchise record for most assists in a single season. He originally broke the record against Albany with his 59th assist.

His 67 assists are the second-most ever by a rookie in NLL history and is only trailing New York's Jeff Teat (71 - 2022)

Meddy Madness

Second-year Transition Player Josh Medeiros is having a career year and is currently leading the league amonst transition players with 21 goals. He has set career highs this season in goals (21), loose balls (91) and caused turnovers (12).

The Transition Player of the Year Candidate has recorded a goal now in 12 of the team's last 14 games, including two games with a hat trick.

Power Play Phil

Phil Caputo leads the team with 12 power-play goals this season. The 12 goals on the man advantage are a new career high, after recording his career high of eight power-play goals last season. Caputo's 12 power-play goals this year are tied for the second most in the NLL.

Goalie Goals Squared

Goalie Nick Damude recorded his second career goal at Colorado (2/24). His first career goal also came against Colorado (3/11/22). Damude is the only goalie to score a goal in the NLL over the past two seasons and the first since Doug Jamieson (New England) on 4/27/19.

Damude is now one of five goalies in NLL history to score more than one goal in their careers. Rob Blasdell leads all goalies in NLL history with four goals scored.

Damude had a five-game streak of recording a point dating from 2/24 to 4/8 and for the season has recorded one goal and five assists.

2022-23 SEASON GAME NOTES

Texas Two Step

Against Vancouver (1/28/23), Will Malcom recorded 13 points (5G/8A) and Jonathan Donville recorded 12 points (4G/8A) in the team's 20-7 victory.

Malcom and Donville became the first set of teammates since stats became available in 2005 in NLL history to each record 12+ points in a single game.

Legendary Lax

Against Vancouver (1/28/23), Jonathan Donville recorded 12 points (4G/8A), which were the second most points scored in a single game in NLL history by a rookie, tying NLL legend Gary Gait.

Leading From The Front

First overall selection in the 2021 NLL Entry Draft, Jonathan Donville has had his impact immediately felt for Panther City.

Donville currently leads all rookies in points (90), assists (67), power play assists (29) and is second amongst rookies with 23 goals.

Donville has been awarded the NLL Rookie of the Week honors five times (Weeks 3, 6, 9, 11, 14) so far in 2022-23, which set a franchsise record for most Rookie of the Week awards, as Patrick Dodds was a three-time NLL Rookie of the Week winner in 2021-22.

Warrior-Esque Effort

Panther City's offense turned in a historic performance when they defeated the Vancouver Warriors, 20-7 (1/28/23).

The club tied their franchise record for most goals scored in a single game (20), which was last done against Colorado (3/11/22).

The team also set a new franchise record for assists and points in a single game with 35 assists and 55 points.

Will Malcom's eight assists were a career best and five goals tied a career high. Jonathan Donville also chipped in with four goals and eight assists, which are also career highs so far through his young career.

Roaring Rookies

Over the course of the 2022-23 NLL season, Panther City has seen two of their players win NLL Rookie of the Week honors six times, as Jonathan Donville (following Week 3, Week 6, Week 9, Week 11 & Week 14) and Mathieu Gautier (following Week 5) took home the top-performing honors.

Donville: (Week 3 vs. Colorado): Game-high 6 assists

Gautier: (Week 5 at Saskatchewan): 1 goal & 2 assists **Donville:** (Week 6 at Rochester): Team-high 3 goals and added 3 assists

Donville: (Week 9 at Vancouver): 12 points (4G/8A), which tied Gary Gait for second-most points scored in a single game by a rookie in NLL history.

Donville: (Week 11 vs. Vancouver): 8 points (2G/6A)... Led the team in points and assists.

Donville: (Week 14 vs. Saskatchewan): 7 points (2G/5A)...Led the team in assists.

Under the direction of General Manager Bob Hamley and Head Coach Tracey Kelusky, Panther City, in its short history has had four different players win the NLL Rookie of the Week honors for a total of 10 times (J. Donville 5x, P.Dodds: 3x, D. Fairall & M. Gautiuer)

Thou Shall Not Cross

Goalie Nick Damude had a career night against Las Vegas (12/16), allowing a career-low three goals and recording a career-high .909 save percentage. Damude stopped 30 of the 33 shots he faced on the night. His previous career-low of goals allowed was six, against the Mammoth on 3/26/22.

Damude narrowly missed the NLL record for fewest goals allowed in a single game (2). He blanked the Desert Dogs in both the first and fourth quarter.

Damude currently has allowed the fewest goals (3) in a single game in the 2022-23 season.

With that performance, Damude became just the fifth goalie in NLL history to allow three or fewer goals in a full regular-season game.

2022-23 SEASON GAME NOTES

Callum Calling History

In his debut with Panther City, Callum Crawford recorded seven points (2G/5A). On his sixth point of the evening, he moved into 9th place all-time on the NLL's All-Time Points Leaderboard (1,153), passing current Las Vegas Desert Dogs Head Coach/GM Shawn Williams.

Crawford then passed Gary Gait for eighth place in league history (1,166 points) against Colorado (2/18) after his seven point outing.

On 3/18/23 vs. Las Vegas, Crawford recorded his 450 career goal, which now makes him the 11th player all time to reach that milestone in NLL history.

C-Note Notched

Second-year forward Patrick Dodds recorded his 100th career point against Philadelphia on 1/14/23 in his 23rd career game. He became one of the fastest players in league history to reach the 100-point mark.

Jeff Teat, of the New York Riptide, is the fastest to reach the 100-point mark, doing so in 15 career games.

Facing-Off With The Record Books

Tyler Burton became the ninth player in NLL history to record 1,300 face-off wins as he won his first face-off against Las Vegas (12/16).

Burton returns to Calgary this weekend where he spent the previous six season and was part of the NLL Cup winning Roughnecks in 2019.

Keep It 100

Will Malcom and Phil Caputo both recorded their 100th career points on 12/16 against Las Vegas. Malcom accomplished the feat in 27 career games. Caputo crossed the centruy mark on his 50th career game.

Roll Out the Red Carpet

For his efforts in the 2021-22 season, Head Coach Tracey Kelusky was awarded the 2021-22 Les Bartley NLL Head Coach of the Year Award. Kelusky is the first head coach of an expansion team to win Coach of the Year honors since Derek Keenan won the award for the Portland Lumberjax in 2006.

Panther City's leading scorer from 2021-22, Patrick Dodds was also named to the 2021-22 NLL All-Rookie Team following his 84-point season.

JONATHAN DONVILLE WINS 2022-23 NLL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Panther City Lacrosse Club forward Jonathan Donville was named the 2022-23 NLL Rookie of the Year on May 26. 2023.

"Jonathan has been everything we had imagined and more since we selected him as the first overall selection in franchise history," General Manager Bob Hamley said. "From the second he first stepped onto the floor, his lacrosse IQ has stuck out to me and that was seen all season as he competed at the highest level with the greatest lacrosse players in the world and held his own. His future is so bright and we cannot wait to see what's next from him."

Donville, the first overall selection in the 2021 NLL Entry Draft, led all rookies in points (90), which were the fourth-most ever by a rookie in NLL history, and assists (67), which were the second-most ever by a rookie in NLL history. He finished second amongst rookies with 23 goals. For his efforts, Donville was named NLL Rookie of the Week five times this past season, more than any other rookie in the league.

"We picked Jonathan first overall for a reason, even knowing we had to wait a year for him to be with our group," Head Coach Tracey Kelusky said. "Needless to say, he was well worth the wait and is not only an elite player in our league, but he is a great teammate and a great leader for our group. His approach to the game and his desire to get better every time he steps on the floor is why he is so good and why he will continue to be a force in the NLL for years to come."

Donville, the league's top scoring rookie, also finished 9th in the NLL with his 67 assists. His 90 points were the 20th most in the league and he was the only rookie amongst the top 10 in assists and top 20 in points. His 29 power play assists were the most in the league and he finished tied for second in the NLL with 31 power play points.

With his Rookie of the Year honor, Donville has also been selected as a member of the 2022-23 NLL All-Rookie Team, which gives Panther City back-to-back years with an All-Rookie selection, as Patrick Dodds was named to the 2021-22 All-Rookie Team.





The arena is owned by the City of Fort Worth and managed by the not-for-profit operating entity, Trail Drive Management Corp (TDMC). The state-of-the-art arena hosts concerts, sporting events and family entertainment, and is home to Fort Worth Stock Show Rodeo performances.
